



# AAUW Washington Update reports College Graduates' Earnings Vary by Gender, Race, Field

People with bachelor's degrees earn an average of 84 percent more across their lifetimes than those without them, according to a new report by Georgetown University's Center on Education and the Workforce. At the same time, the report warned that gender and race are factors that can trump other predictors of earnings. At every degree level people of color earn less than whites and women earn less than men. For example, the report found that a man who does not complete college is likely to have about the same salary as a woman who graduates with a bachelor's degree. Earnings also vary by field, with those in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields earning more than those

## Girl Up Campaign—Ending Child Marriage

The U.N. Foundation, funded with a huge donation from Ted Turner, has initiated the Girl Up campaign, a program that connects girls in the U.S. with girls in developing countries to raise awareness and money for U.N. programs that help adolescent girls face such difficult issues as child marriage. According to Girl Up, "Child marriage is a human rights violation. Tragically,



1 in 7 girls in developing countries is married by age 15—often to a man twice her age or older." UNICEF estimates that 60 million women in developing countries now aged between 20 and 24 were married before they reached 18; the number of child marriages could reach 100 million during the next decade.

This year, the Girl Up Campaign has mobilized an estimated 150,000 American teens who are dedicated to ending the practice of child marriage. To advocate for their cause, these teens have delivered a petition to the White House with signatures from girls across the U.S. Their petition asks the Obama administration to address the issue of child marriage so that girls in such countries as Ethiopia, Malawi, and Guatemala won't be forced into getting married and bearing children as children themselves. United Nations research results show that the younger the bride, the younger the mother, the higher the fertility rate, the higher the infant mortality rate, and the higher the maternal mortality rate. 

#### THE TRANSFORMATION OF MOTHERHOOD IN MODERN AMERICA


AAUW San Diego members may remember Rebecca Jo Plant sharing her pre-published research at our AAUW EF Red Sock Luncheon in December 2006. An associate professor in the History Department at UCSD, Rebecca received her Ph.D. in History from Johns Hopkins University and taught for two years at Vanderbilt University before settling in San Diego.

Dr. Plant's work focuses on gender relations and the rise of a therapeutic culture in the 20th-century U.S. Her book, **Mom: The Transformation of Motherhood in Modern America**, recently has been published by the University of Chicago Press. It is based on her Ph.D. thesis, which in 2003 was awarded the Lerner-Scott Prize from the Organization of American Historians for the best dissertation in U.S. women's and gender history. fields – even those with higher degrees. The research <u>showed</u> that a person with a career in a STEM field who has not completed college will usually earn close to 30 percent more than a teacher with a master's degree. AAUW <u>advocates</u> for increased support for and access

to higher education for women and other disadvantaged populations. In particular, AAUW <u>supports</u> promoting and strengthening STEM education for girls and other underrepresented populations. AAUW's 2010 research <u>report</u>, *Why So Few? Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics*, explored environmental and social barriers, including stereotypes and gender bias, that block women's participation in STEM related fields.
